- 8. in (The movie will be released in July. We use "in" to indicate a general period of time.)
- 9. on (She has dance lessons on Monday evenings. We use "on" to specify particular days.)
- 10. next (They have a science test next week. We use "next" to indicate a future time.)
- 11. at (The museum is open at 10 AM. We use "at" to denote a specific time.)
- 12. in (We go skiing in the winter. We use "in" to indicate a general period of time.)
- 13. on (The play will be performed on Friday night. We use "on" to specify a specific day or date.)
- 14. in (We have a family reunion in August. We use "in" to indicate a general period of time.)
- 15. at (The meeting is scheduled at 2 PM. We use "at" to denote a specific time.)
