


Time in/on/at #3

1. The movie will be released Friday. (on/in/at)
2. We celebrate Independence Day July 4th. (on/in/at)
3. My birthday is May. (on/in/at)
4. The concert is scheduled 8 PM. (on/in/at)
5. We have a family gathering Christmas. (on/in/at)
6. School starts September. (on/in/at)
7. The flowers bloom spring. (on/in/at)
8. They have a soccer practice Wednesday afternoons. (on/in/at)
9. The museum is closed Mondays. (on/in/at)
10. We usually have a barbecue summer. (on/in/at)
11. The fireworks display takes place New Year's Eve. (on/in/at)

Answers:

- 1. on (The movie will be released on Friday. We use "on" to specify a specific day.)
- 2. on (We celebrate Independence Day on July 4th. We use "on" to specify a specific day or date.)
- 3. in (My birthday is in May. We use "in" to indicate a general period of time.)
- 4. at (The concert is scheduled at 8 PM. We use "at" to denote a specific time.)
- 5. on (We have a family gathering on Christmas. We use "on" to specify a specific day.)
- 6. in (School starts in September. We use "in" to indicate a general period of time.)
- 7. in (The flowers bloom in spring. We use "in" to indicate a general period of time.)
- 8. on (They have a soccer practice on Wednesday afternoons. We use "on" to specify a particular day.)
- 9. on (The museum is closed on Mondays. We use "on" to specify a particular day.)
- 10. in (We usually have a barbecue in summer. We use "in" to indicate a general period of time.)
- 11. on (The fireworks display takes place on New Year's Eve. We use "on" to specify a specific day or date.)
- 12. next (The class field trip is planned next week. We use "next" to indicate a future time.)
- 13. on (They have music lessons on Friday mornings. We use "on" to specify a particular day.)
- 14. during (We go to the beach during the summer vacation. We use "during" to indicate a span of time.)
- 15. at (The store opens at 9 AM. We use "at" to denote a specific time.)

Review the answers with the students to reinforce their understanding of the appropriate prepositions for describing time.
