

Mini Lesson 009 - Using the Future with Time Clauses

Using the Future with Time Clauses

When discussing future events, English has an unusual quirk: we often use the present tense in time clauses, even though the event is in the future. This can be confusing at first, but with practice, it becomes second nature.

Example:

- Main clause (Future tense): I will text you.
- Time clause (Present tense): when I arrive at the airport.

Notice that the time clause uses the present simple ("arrive") even though it refers to a future event. This structure helps make sentences sound more natural and fluid.

Important: Avoid using "will" in both clauses. Instead of saying, "I will text you when I will arrive," simply say, "I will text you when I arrive."

Common Time Expressions:

- When: I'll call you when I reach the station.
- After: She'll send the email after she completes the report.
- **Before:** They'll leave **before** the sun sets.
- As soon as: I'll reply as soon as I get your message.
- Once: We'll start dinner once everyone is here.
- In case: Bring your coat in case it gets chilly.
- While: I'll finish the presentation while you make dinner.
- Whether or not: He'll attend the meeting whether or not it's scheduled late.
- Whatever: She'll support you whatever decision you make.
- The moment (that): I'll call you the moment the package arrives.
- The minute (that): She'll step in the minute that the class begins.
