



Mini Lesson 017 - The Present Simple for Permanent Situations

Explanation:

The present simple tense is primarily used to describe permanent situations. These are situations or states that exist over a long period and are expected to continue indefinitely.

Permanent Situations refer to conditions or facts that cross the present moment and are not temporary. We use the present simple to describe:

1. **General Statements and Universal Truths:** Facts that are always true, such as scientific or mathematical truths.

- **Example:** "Water boils at 100 degrees Celsius."

2. **Long-term Personal Situations:** Conditions in our lives that have been consistent over time and are expected to remain unchanged for the foreseeable future.

- **Example:** "She works as a doctor."

3. **Habitual Actions:** Actions that are repeated regularly and have become part of a routine.

- **Example:** "He goes jogging every morning."

4. **Stative Verbs for Temporary States:** Stative verbs can also be used in the present simple to describe states that are current but may not last long. Unlike dynamic verbs, which describe actions, stative verbs describe a state of being.

- **Example:** "She loves chocolate." (Stative verb)

- **Example:** "He feels tired." (Temporary state)

Remember, the present simple is not used for actions that are happening right now; for those, we use the present continuous tense.
