

Mini Lesson 019 - Comparatives and Superlatives

Explanation:

Comparatives and superlatives are used to compare people, things, or actions.

- **Comparatives** are used to compare two items, showing that one has a higher degree of a quality than the other.
 - Forming Comparatives:
 - For short adjectives (one syllable), add **-er** to the adjective:
 - Example: *tall → taller*
 - For adjectives ending in -y, change the -y to -ier:
 - Example: *happy → happier*
 - For longer adjectives (two syllables or more), use more before the adjective:
 - Example: *beautiful → more beautiful*
 - Using Comparatives:
 - Example: "She is taller than her brother."
- **Superlatives** are used to compare three or more items, showing that one has the highest degree of a quality.
 - Forming Superlatives:
 - For short adjectives (one syllable), add **-est** to the adjective:
 - Example: *tall → tallest*
 - For adjectives ending in -y, change the -y to **-iest**:
 - Example: *happy → happiest*
 - For longer adjectives (two syllables or more), use **most** before the adjective:
 - Example: *beautiful → most beautiful*
 - Using Superlatives:
 - Example: "She is the tallest in her class."
