



Mini Lesson 024 - Using 'Used To' for Past Habits

Quantifiers like **'some,' 'any,' 'much,'** and **'many'** are used to express quantities or amounts. Their usage depends on whether the noun is countable or uncountable, and whether the sentence is positive, negative, or a question.

'Some' and 'Any':

- **'Some'** is generally used in positive sentences with both countable and uncountable nouns.

- Example: *I have some apples.* (countable)

- Example: *We need some sugar.* (uncountable)

- **'Any'** is used in negative sentences and questions.

- Example: *I don't have any apples.* (negative, countable)

- Example: *Do we need any sugar?*

'Much' and 'Many':

- **'Much'** is used with uncountable nouns, often in negative sentences and questions.

- Example: *There isn't much time left.*

- Example: *How much water do you drink?*

- **'Many'** is used with countable nouns, often in negative sentences and questions.

- Example: *I don't have many friends.*

- Example: *How many books do you own?*
