

Mini Lesson 024 - Using 'Used To' for Past Habits

Quantifiers like 'some,' 'any,' 'much,' and 'many' are used to express quantities or amounts. Their usage depends on whether the noun is countable or uncountable, and whether the sentence is positive, negative, or a question.

'Some' and 'Any':

- 'Some' is generally used in positive sentences with both countable and uncountable nouns.
 - Example: *I have some apples.* (countable)
 - Example: *We need some sugar.* (uncountable)
- 'Any' is used in negative sentences and questions.
 - Example: *I don't have any apples.* (negative, countable)
 - Example: *Do we need any sugar?* (question, uncountable)

'Much' and 'Many':

- 'Much' is used with uncountable nouns, often in negative sentences and questions.
 - Example: *There isn't much time left.*
 - Example: *How much water do you drink?*
- 'Many' is used with countable nouns, often in negative sentences and questions.
 - Example: *I don't have many friends.*
 - Example: *How many books do you own?*
