Explanation:

Conditional sentences type 1 are used to express real or possible situations that may happen in the present or future if a specific condition is met. These sentences follow this structure:

- If + present simple, will + base form of the verb

- Example: *If it rains, I will stay home.*

Uses of Conditional Sentences Type 1:

1. Realistic Conditions:

These are likely to happen in the present or future.

- Example: *If I study hard, I will pass the exam.*

2. Offers and Promises:

You can use them to make offers or promises.

- Example: *If you need help, I will support you.*

3. Warnings or Threats:

Conditional type 1 can express warnings or threats.

- Example: *If you don't hurry, you will miss the bus.*
