

Mini Lesson 029 - Distinguishing Between 'Say' and 'Tell'

Explanation:

The verbs **'say'** and **'tell'** are used in reporting speech, but they serve different purposes.

Uses of 'Say':

- 'Say' is used when focusing on the words themselves, often without mentioning who they are directed to.
 - Example: *He said that he was tired.*
- It can be used with or without quoting the exact words.
- Example: *She said, "I'm coming."*
- Example: *She said she was coming.*

Uses of 'Tell':

- 'Tell' is used when someone is speaking directly to a person, and it usually requires an object (someone).
 - Example: *She told me the news.*
- It is also used for giving instructions or orders.
 - Example: *The teacher told the students to sit down.*
