Mini Lesson 034 - Indefinite Pronouns: Everyone, No One, Somebody

Explanation:

Indefinite pronouns refer to non-specific people or things. They include words like *everyone*, *no one*, and *somebody*. These pronouns are used when we do not need to mention exactly who or what we are talking about.

- Everyone refers to all the people in a group.
 - Example: *Everyone is invited to the party.*
- No one means not a single person.
 - Example: *No one knew the answer to the question.*
- **Somebody** refers to an unspecified person.
- Example: *Somebody left their phone on the table.*

Rules:

- **Singular Verbs:** Even though these pronouns might seem plural, they take singular verbs.
 - Example: *Everyone loves the movie.*
- **Possessive Adjectives:** When using possessive adjectives, use *their* to avoid gender-specific language.
 - Example: *Somebody left their bag behind.*
