



Mini Lesson 040 - The Use of 'Should Have' and 'Could Have'

- **Should have** is used to express regret or criticize a past action. It suggests that something would have been a good idea, but it didn't happen.

- Example: *I should have studied harder for the exam.* (But I didn't.)

- **Could have** is used to express possibility or ability in the past that did not happen.

- Example: *She could have won the race.* (But she didn't.)

Form:

- **Affirmative:** Subject + **should have/could have** + Past Participle

- **Negative:** Subject + **should not have/could not have** + Past Participle

- **Questions:** **Should/Could** + Subject + **have** + Past Participle?
