Mini Lesson 041 - Direct and Indirect Objects

Explanation:

When comparing two things, we use "like" or "as", but they are used differently:

1. Like:

- Used to compare **nouns** (people or things). It is followed by a noun, pronoun, or noun phrase.
 - Example: *She sings like an angel.* (Comparison with a noun)

2. **As**:

- Used to compare **actions** or to describe the way something is done. It is followed by a **subject + verb**.
 - Example: *He runs as fast as I do.* (Comparison with an action)

Key Rule:

- Use "like" when comparing nouns (She dances like a professional).
- Use "as" when comparing actions or stating how something happens (She dances as a professional would).
