Mini Lesson 043 - Expressing Preferences with 'Prefer' and 'Would Rather'

Explanation:

When talking about preferences, we use **"prefer"** and **"would rather"** to indicate choices. Both are used to express likes and dislikes, but they differ in usage.

1 Prefer:

- Used to express a **general** preference between two or more things.
- **Form**: *prefer* + noun/verb-ing + **to** + noun/verb-ing.
- Example: *I prefer tea to coffee.* / *I prefer swimming to running.*

2. Would Rather:

- Used to express a **specific** preference in a particular situation. It's often used to compare immediate choices.
 - Form: *would rather* + base verb (without "to") + than + base verb.
 - Example: *I would rather stay at home than go out.*

Key Differences:

- Use **prefer** when talking about general preferences.
- Use would rather for specific, immediate choices.
