



Mini Lesson 048 - Using 'Although', 'Despite', and 'In Spite Of'

Explanation:

Although, **despite**, and **in spite of** are all used to show contrast, but they differ in how they are used in sentences.

1. **Although**:

- Used before a subject and a verb.
- **Form**: *Although* + subject + verb
- Example: *Although it was raining, we went for a walk.*

2. **Despite / In Spite Of**:

- Both are followed by a noun, pronoun, or verb in the gerund (-ing) form. They are interchangeable.

- **Form**: *Despite/In spite of* + noun / pronoun / verb-ing
- Example: *Despite the rain, we went for a walk.*
In spite of feeling tired, he completed the race.
