

### Mini Lesson 057 - Commonly Confused Words (Advice vs. Advise)

Advice and advise are two words that many people mix up. Understanding the difference between them is essential for clear communication.

**Advice** (noun) refers to guidance or recommendations regarding a decision or course of action. Example: My teacher gave me great advice on how to study for the exam.

Advise (verb) means to offer suggestions or recommendations.

Example: I advise you to start studying early for the exam.

### When to use each word:

- Use advice when you are talking about the suggestions you receive.
- Use advise when you are suggesting or recommending something to someone.

### **Examples:**

- Correct: I need some advice from a teacher.
- Correct: Teachers advise students to complete their homework on time.

### **Common Mistakes:**

- Incorrect: She will advice me on what to do.
- Correct: She will advise me on what to do.
