



Mini Lesson 062 - Using 'Although', 'Even Though', and 'Despite the Fact That'

In English, we use "although," "even though," and "despite the fact that" to show contrast between two ideas. These phrases help connect sentences and show that one idea is surprising or unexpected given the other idea.

Although and **Even though** are conjunctions that introduce a contrast. They can be used interchangeably, although "even though" emphasizes the contrast more strongly.

Example:

- Although it was raining, we went for a walk.
- Even though it was raining, we went for a walk.

Despite the fact that is used when you want to include a stronger contrast and can be used at the beginning of a sentence or in the middle.

Example:

- Despite the fact that it was raining, we went for a walk.

Structure:

- Affirmative: Although/Even though + clause, main clause
- Example: Although she was tired, she finished her homework.

- Negative: Despite the fact that + clause, main clause
- Example: Despite the fact that she was tired, she finished her homework.
