

Mini Lesson 063 - Differentiating Between 'Say' and 'Tell'

The verbs 'say' and 'tell' are often confused, but they have different uses in English. Understanding how to use them correctly is important for clear communication.

Say is used when you want to express something in words. It often does not require a specific object after it.

Example: "She said that she would come."

Tell is used when you give information to someone, and it always requires an object (the person you are speaking to). Example: "She told me a story."

When to use each word:

- Use 'say' when you are quoting someone or providing a statement.
- Use 'tell' when you are talking about communication directed towards someone.

Examples:

- Correct: He said, "I am going to the park."
- Correct: He told me that he was going to the park.

Common Mistakes:

- Incorrect: She said me about the event.
- Correct: She told me about the event.
