

Mini Lesson 080 - The Passive Voice in Different Tenses

The passive voice is used when we want to focus on the action and the receiver of the action rather than who or what is performing the action. The structure of the passive voice varies depending on the tense being used.

When to use the Passive Voice:

- To emphasize the action or the recipient of the action rather than the doer.
- When the doer of the action is unknown or unimportant.

Structure:

- Present Simple: Subject + is/are + past participle
- Example: The book is read by many students.
- Past Simple: Subject + was/were + past participle
- Example: The project was completed last week.
- Future Simple: Subject + will be + past participle
- Example: The cake will be baked by my mother tomorrow.
- Present Continuous: Subject + is/are being + past participle
- Example: The movie is being watched by a large audience.
- Past Continuous: Subject + was/were being + past participle
- Example: The flowers were being watered by the gardener.
