



Mini Lesson 107 - The Passive Voice in the Future Tense

The passive voice is used when we want to focus on the action being done rather than who is doing it. In the future tense, we form the passive voice using "will be" + past participle of the verb.

When to use the Passive Voice in the Future Tense:

- To talk about actions that will happen without mentioning who performs the action.
- Example: "The project will be completed by the team next week."

Structure:

- Affirmative: Subject + will be + past participle
- Example: "The homework will be checked by the teacher."

- Negative: Subject + will not (won't) be + past participle
- Example: "The letter won't be sent until tomorrow."

- Questions: Will + subject + be + past participle?
- Example: "Will the report be finished by noon?"
