



Mini Lesson 108 - Using 'In Case' and 'If' for Conditions

The phrases 'in case' and 'if' are commonly used when discussing conditions or possible situations. Understanding the difference between these two phrases will help you communicate more clearly.

'If' is used to introduce a condition or to talk about something that may happen.

Example: *If it rains, we will stay indoors.*

'In case' is used to refer to a precaution or preparation for a possible situation that may or may not happen. Example: *Take an umbrella in case it rains.*

When to use each phrase:

- Use **'if'** to express a condition:
 - Example: *If I see John, I will tell him about the party.*
- Use **'in case'** to prepare for a situation:
 - Example: *Bring your textbook in case we have a quiz.*

Examples:

- Correct usage of 'if': *If the train is late, I will wait for it.*
- Correct usage of 'in case': *Put on a jacket in case it gets cold.*
