

Mini Lesson 124 - The Passive Voice with Modal Verbs

The passive voice with modal verbs is used to emphasize the action being done to the subject rather than who is performing the action. We can use modal verbs such as can, could, may, might, must, shall, should, and would in the passive voice.

Structure of Passive Voice with Modal Verbs:

- Affirmative: Subject + modal verb + be + past participle
- Example: The homework can be completed by the students.
- Negative: Subject + modal verb + not + be + past participle
- Example: The book must not be returned until next week.
- Questions: Modal verb + subject + be + past participle?
- Example: Should the project be submitted by Friday?

When to Use Passive Voice with Modal Verbs:

- To focus on the action rather than the doer.
- When the doer is unknown or unimportant.
- To express possibility, necessity, or permission related to an action.
