Mini Lesson 092 - The Use of 'Whose' in Possessive Clauses

The word 'whose' is used to show possession and is often used in questions or relative clauses. It refers to people and can determine ownership or relationship.

When to use 'whose':

- To ask about ownership:
- Example: Whose book is this?
- To give more information about someone:
- Example: The girl whose bike is red is my sister.

Structure:

- 'Whose' is followed by a noun to indicate who owns the noun.
- Example: The teacher whose car is blue loves science.
